#### Monday 20th

On Monday 20th March the Italian team was impatiently waiting for the YOLO students to arrive in Italy. While the Turkish team was landing in Milan, the Romanian, Martinican and Macedonian teams were landing in Bergamo, the Czech team was reaching Brescia by bus.

Since no activity was planned for the arrival day, the teams could take a brief tour of the frenetic Brescia and discover its beautiful squares, restaurants and shops.

#### **Tuesday 21st**

The activities started on Tuesday 21st at IIS Gigli in Rovato, with the Italian team welcoming our hosts and school principal Mr. Davide Uboldi giving a speech. Then, ice-breaking activities followed and between one game and the other it was time to reach the Rovato Town Hall for an official welcome and a visit to the municipality. Once back to school, we had a presentation of the teams and a selfie challenge to make students discover the school. For lunch we experienced a gastronomic journey with the multicultural lunch: we could taste typical delicacies from each country. After lunch, we led a visit to Brescia and guided the students on an organized tour of the major sites of interest in the city.

Finally, for dinner, all the teams had a typical local meal in a restaurant in the city center.









On Wednesday 22nd, a trip to Milan was scheduled. An art teacher from Gigli Institute led a guided tour of the city which gave the students the opportunity to find out curious secrets about Milan and its buildings. Duomo Square and Galleria Vittorio Emanuele were crowded with tourists taking pictures and so did the YOLO students.

Thanks to the warm weather and the amazing company, we could feel like it was a summer day of vacation.

If Milan impressed our hosts, Venice left them astonished. We visited the city on Thursday but one day wasn't enough to fully appreciate its splendor. The visit proceeded at a slow pace because in every corner of Venice there was something to take a picture of.

To farewell the city we took the water bus: we enjoyed a last view of the city from a distance and felt small in front of the buildings next to which we walked minutes before.

#### Friday 24th

On Friday the 24th, we met in the school library, where the Italian students gave a presentation about debating. Mrs. Giordano, the English mother tongue teacher working at Gigli, coordinated the activity together with the Italian team. After dividing the students into groups and giving them a role and a topic, the debate began. Everyone did their job and a brief feedback showed that the majority of the participants changed their minds about certain subjects of discussion, as it is the aim of a debate. After that, students met in the art laboratory to complete another task: choose an emotion and draw how they felt it. Out of this art lab, we saw the teens' different outlooks on life and how amazingly similar they were to each other despite their cultural diversity.

In the afternoon the teams could experience a pizza lab and a visit to Franciacorta Boccadoro winery, followed by a walk and shopping at Franciacorta Outlet Village.

In the evening we met in Brescia for the farewell party and the official ceremony for handing the certificates to all of those who attended the mobility.



#### Saturday 25th

On Saturday morning the teams competed in Olympic races: a treasure hunt was organized on top of Brescia's Medieval Castle. While exploring the building we could consolidate our friendship by maturing a spirit of cooperation and mutual help.

#### Bozhidar


